



Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

Version 2.0 – January 2026

CET is committed to responsible sourcing and conducting business with ethics and integrity. This policy statement outlines our commitment to addressing the critical minerals, including Cobalt, Copper, Graphite, Lithium, Mica, and Nickel, as well as their associated social and environmental concerns. In this statement, references to "CET" and "we" are to CET ELECTRIC TECHNOLOGY INC. together with its consolidated subsidiaries.

Critical minerals are essential components in many electronic, energy, automotive, and industrial products. However, their extraction and supply chains may be associated with significant risks, including:

- Environmental Degradation: Such as water pollution, deforestation, and ecosystem damage.
- Social and Labor Rights Issues: Including forced labor, child labor, unsafe working conditions, and infringement of community rights.
- Governance and Transparency Challenges: Such as corruption, illegal mining, and the financing of conflicts or human rights abuses.

CET recognizes that while these minerals may not be classified as "Conflict Minerals" in the traditional sense (like 3TG), their supply chains can still originate from or transit through high-risk areas with weak governance.

CET condemns any environmental destruction, human rights violations, or corrupt practices linked to the mining, trading, or processing of minerals.

We are implementing a due diligence process consistent with the guidelines established by the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas. This process includes:

- Identifying and mapping our supply chain to understand the origin of our materials.
- Engaging with our suppliers to obtain information on the source of their critical minerals.
- Encouraging our suppliers to adopt responsible sourcing practices.
- Conducting risk assessments to identify potential issues in our supply chain.
- We will communicate our expectations to our suppliers through a clear Supplier Code of Conduct that prohibits sourcing minerals from high-risk or non-compliant origins

We recognize that this is an ongoing process, and We will regularly review and update this policy and its associated procedures to align with evolving regulations, industry best practices, and stakeholder expectations.

CET will regularly review and update our policies and practices as new information becomes available. We provide our customers with a standardized RMI Extended Mineral Reporting Template (EMRT), which traces the metals back through the supply chain. We encourage employees, suppliers, customers, and other stakeholders to report any concerns regarding potential environmental, social, or governance issues within our supply chains.

CET is committed to being a responsible corporate citizen and contributing to a more ethical and sustainable global supply chain. Through this policy, we reaffirm our steadfast commitment to environmental, social, and governance responsibilities.
